## Florida Board of Bar Examiners Releases July 2023 General Bar Examination Results

The Chair of the Florida Board of Bar Examiners, the Honorable Rachele Munson of Tallahassee, announces that the results of the July 2023 General Bar Examination are approved for release by the Supreme Court of Florida.

There were 2,163 first-time applicants<sup>1</sup> who took the full Bar Examination<sup>2</sup> on July 25-26, 2023, in Tampa. There were 1,548 first-time full Bar Exam applicants who passed the July test. This represents a 71.6-percent passage rate among those test takers.

The Court approved 1,683 candidates for admission to The Florida Bar. Chief Justice Carlos G. Muñoz announced they may be sworn in as members of The Florida Bar. Exam passage is but one step required before individuals may be admitted to The Florida Bar. Because some of those steps are not yet complete, as well as the multiple ways individuals may take different portions of the exam, the number of candidates approved for admission may be smaller, or larger, than the number of first-time test-takers who passed the exam.

<sup>1</sup> Results of any scores impounded by the Supreme Court of Florida are not included.

<sup>2</sup> The Bar Examination consists of multiple parts; Part A and Part B of the General Bar Examination and the Multistate Professional Responsibility Examination. Some applicants take only one part of the exam. Applicants repeating the exam need only take portions they have not passed previously. Applicants may also transfer a timely passing MBE score from another jurisdiction and only need take Part A of the General Bar Examination.
